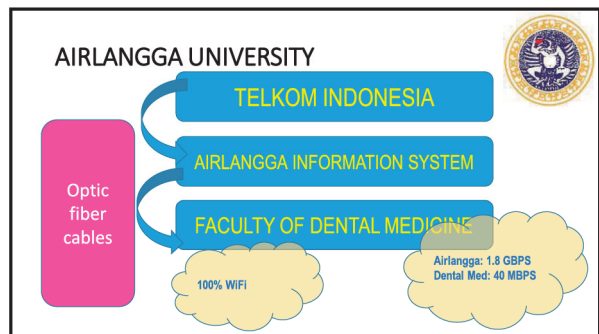

No significant problems

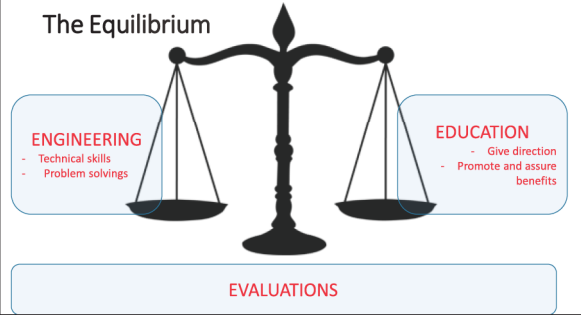
Quality of sound and visual are OK
