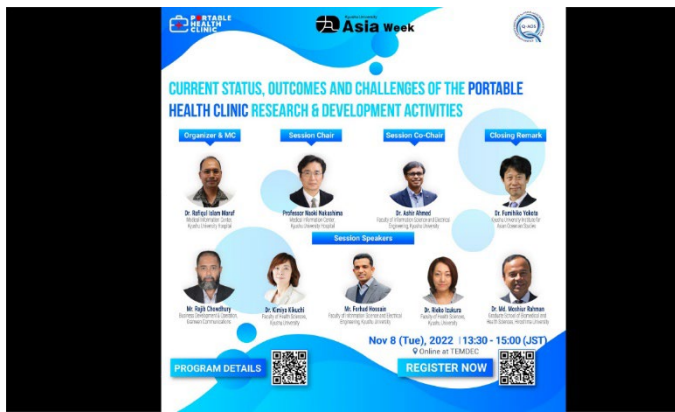

The Portable Health Clinic (PHC) system was originally developed as a telehealth system for primary care with a focus on non-communicable diseases. Gradually, this system has expanded its targets including eye, maternal & child health, and COVID-19. Recently, it has added a new module for physically challenged and disabled people. This session presented the current practices, outcomes, and a micro health entrepreneurship development program to expand the services to the rural communities. Finally, there was a panel discussion on the challenges of the PHC services and their way-outs for ensuring quality service.



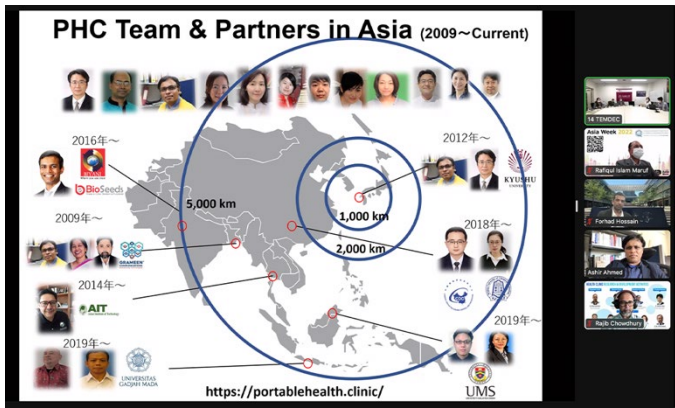

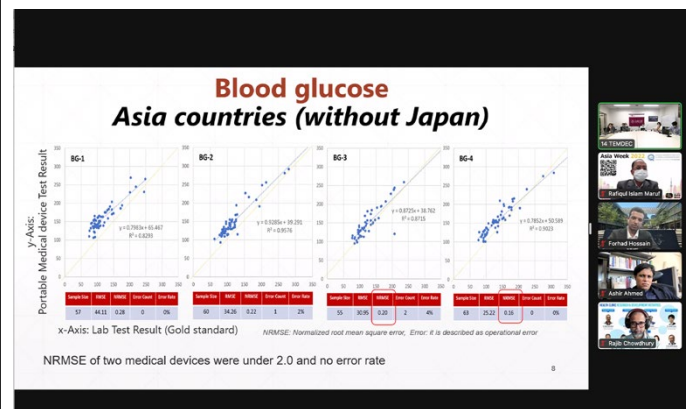
