

4. Sessions in Charge

Engineers in a Program

Engineer's workflow (ideal)

~1 month before

- Chief engineer and local engineer will be decided.
- Chief engineer decide the system to be used.
- Engineers start to communicate.

~1 week before

- Chief engineer make technical announcement.
- Connectivity test will be conducted.

APAN week

- Venue setup (Network, Audio and Video System control)
- Prepare and work for technical support.
